Welcome back after the Christmas holiday. I hope you all enjoyed the break and relaxed with family and friends.

We enjoyed The Oaks nativity and the visit by animals from Welgate Farm. It certainly got us into the Christmas mood!

Screening sessions for those in Stepping Stones and other three to four year olds for next year's Reception classes took place as usual and offers have been sent out.

At The Oaks Christmas Holiday Club - children enjoyed art/craft, cookery, games and other activities including helping Stepping Stones with their nativity. Do check for details of clubs this term and book your place if you are interested.

Children are offered places at Stepping Stones each month as they can join us the month after their second birthday, so if your child will be two in the coming months do speak to Jane. It is never too early to register at The Oaks or Eastcourt. We do not charge for this service.

Year 6 are to be congratulated on their results in the National Primary Maths Challenge. Thousands of children compete in this competition. We are proud that some Year 6 children have been selected to take part in the final. We wish them luck.

Eastcourt's next Results Open Day will be on 14th March. At this time the offers of secondary school places in both state and independent schools will have been made. It is the time when the 100+ results that were above the Grammar School cut off points are converted into offers of places. Prospective parents/carers are welcome to come along between 10 am and 12 noon to meet the staff and view some of our pupils' work. It is a chance for you to see where your child is heading next year and beyond, looking at the achievements of Year 6 in 2020 and finding out more about how you can help in this preparation. Working together starts from the moment children join us and moves steadily towards the final exams, so it is never too early to look at what is involved.

Please spread the word about this event to anyone who may be interested, and remember it is a time for you, your family and friends to come along too.

Over the coming months we will be organizing parent workshops for each year group to outline the curriculum and ways in which we can work together.

Here's to a happy and successful 2020! In particular we wish Year 6 luck in their public school examinations this half term - they will already have taken place by the time you read this!

Last term we organised a workshop for our Reception families. Children and parents joined us to find out more about the Early Learning Goals, how we work towards them and ways children can work at home.

We intend to continue running parent workshops for Years 2 – 5. There will be adult only sessions providing information and ideas including discussion and hands-on tasks where parents assume the role of the children.

These sessions are open to anyone with children in the relevant age group. They will give you a chance to learn more about the way we can work together and outsiders the opportunity to compare what we offer with what is offered by the school their children currently attend.





In the Spring Term junior sports will be hockey and basketball. Children will wear their football kit for hockey lessons. Boys will have hockey and girls basketball until half term: they will then swap over after the break. All children are expected to have their kit for these lessons as sport is a compulsory part of every school's curriculum.




Classes run half termly. Children taking part are expected to attend all sessions.


Fitness with Kirsty

The Oaks Activity Centre Holiday Club






